We are continuing our plan from last year, as we have seen great growth in reading. By May 2016, there will be an increase in comparison to August 2015, of students at or above benchmark in reading fluency, according to DIBLES, in grades k-6.

## Measurements

The Ranches Academy will use the composite score in DIBELS for kindergarten and first grade and the DORF (reading fluency) in DIBELS for grades 2-6. The composite score will be used for kindergarten and first grade students as they do not have oral reading fluency until the end of first grade. Data will be compared from the beginning year benchmark to end of year benchmark assessments.

All grades increased the number of students reading on or above grade level with the exception of 6th grade. There was one student that dropped from on to below grade level.

The Ranches Academy will purchase at least 6 computers per classroom with the exception of 6th grade as they currently have one to one devices and kindergarten as their time is limited. 2. Software will be purchased such as Read Naturally, IXL, Brainpop, Razz Kids, and or Book Flicks. 3. Students not reading at or above grade level will have extra exposure to reading and phonics practice at least 3 times a week on the classroom computers. 4. Teachers will progress monitor these students and track their growth. 5. The students will also be pulled individually or in small group for additional instruction from the teacher or teaching assistant.

**Please explain how the action plan was implemented to reach this goal.**

1. The Ranches Academy purchased an additional 6 computers for each classroom in grades 1-4. Extra funding was used to purchase enough computers for 5th grade to have one to one computers like 6th grade. A class set of ipads was purchased for kindergarten.
2. Software was purchased to support reading instruction in the classroom. Programs purchased include Read Naturally, IXL, Brainpop, and Razz Kids.
3. Students below grade level received additional instruction at least 3 times a week.
4. Teachers progress monitored their students with DIBELS and adjusted instruction and software programs as needed.
5. Students were pulled for small group instruction during our RtI block by either the teacher or the teaching assistant.
